### PRECEDENCE

- EMERGENCY** Any message having life and death urgency to any person or group of persons, that is transmitted by Amateur Radio in the absence of regular commercial facilities. This includes messages of welfare agencies during emergencies requesting supplies, materials, or instructions vital to relief efforts for the stricken population in emergency areas. On CW and digital modes, this designation will always be spelled out. When in doubt, do not use this designation.
- P= PRIORITY** This classification is for important messages having a specific time limit. Official messages not covered in the emergency category, press dispatches, and emergency-related traffic not of the utmost urgency.
- W=WELFARE** This classification refers to an inquiry about the health and welfare of an individual in the disaster area, or to an advisory from the disaster area that indicates "all is well". Welfare traffic is handled only after all emergency and priority traffic is cleared. The American Red Cross equivalent to an incoming Welfare message is DWI (Disaster Welfare Inquiry).
- R=ROUTINE** Most traffic in normal times will bear this designation. In disaster situations, traffic labeled routine should be handled last or not at all, when circuits are busy with higher-precedence traffic.

### HX: HANDLING INSTRUCTIONS

- HXA\_** (Followed by number) Collect landline delivery authorized by addressee within \_\_\_ miles. (If no number, authorization is unlimited)
- HXB\_** (Followed by number) Cancel message if not delivered within \_\_\_ hours of filing time; service originating station.
- HXC** Report date and time of delivery. (TOD) to originating station.
- HXD** Report to originating station the identity of station from which received, plus date and time. Report identity of station to which relayed, plus date and time, or if delivered, report date, time, and method of delivery.
- HXE** Delivering station get reply from addressee, originate message back.
- HXF\_** (Followed by number) Hold delivery until \_\_\_\_ (date).
- HXG** Delivery by mail or landline toll call not required. If toll or other expense involved, cancel message and service originating station.

### ARRL NUMBERED MESSAGES

#### Group One—For Possible Relief Emergency Use

- ONE Everyone safe here. Please don't worry.
- TWO Coming home as soon as possible.
- THREE Am in \_\_\_ hospital. Receiving excellent care and recovering fine.
- FOUR Only slight property damage here. Do not be concerned about disaster reports.
- FIVE Am moving to new location. Send no further mail or communication. Will inform you of new address when relocated.
- SIX Will contact you as soon as possible.
- SEVEN Please reply by Amateur Radio through the amateur delivering this message. This is a free public service.
- EIGHT Need additional \_\_\_ mobile or portable equipment for immediate emergency use.
- NINE Additional \_\_\_ radio operators needed to assist with emergency at this location.
- TEN Please contact \_\_\_. Advise to standby and provide further emergency information, instructions or assistance.
- ELEVEN Establish Amateur Radio emergency communications with \_\_\_ on \_\_\_ MHz.
- TWELVE Anxious to hear from you. No word in some time. Please contact me as soon as possible.
- THIRTEEN Medical emergency situation exists here.
- FOURTEEN Situation here becoming critical. Losses and damage from \_\_\_ increasing.
- FIFTEEN Please advise your condition and what help is needed.
- SIXTEEN Property damage very severe in this area.
- SEVENTEEN REACT communications services also available. Establish REACT communication with \_\_\_ on channel
- EIGHTEEN Please contact me as soon as possible at \_\_\_\_\_.
- NINETEEN Request health and welfare report on \_\_\_. (State name, address and telephone number.)
- TWENTY Temporarily stranded. Will need some assistance. Please contact me at \_\_\_\_\_.
- TWENTY ONE Search and Rescue assistance is needed by local authorities here. Advise availability.
- TWENTY TWO Need accurate information on the extent and type of conditions now existing at your location. Please furnish this information and reply without delay.
- TWENTY THREE Report at once the accessibility and best way to reach your location.
- TWENTY FOUR Evacuation of residents from this area urgently needed. Advise plans for help.
- TWENTY FIVE Furnish as soon as possible the weather conditions at your location.
- TWENTY SIX Help and care for evacuation of sick and injured from this location needed at once.

#### Group Two—Routine Messages

- FORTY SIX Greetings on your birthday and best wishes for many more to come.
- FORTY SEVEN Reference your message number \_\_\_ to \_\_\_ delivered on \_\_\_ at \_\_\_ UTC.
- FIFTY Greetings by Amateur Radio.
- FIFTY ONE Greetings by Amateur Radio. This message is sent as a free public service by ham radio operators at \_\_\_\_\_. Am having a wonderful time.
- FIFTY TWO Really enjoyed being with you. Looking forward to getting together again.
- FIFTY THREE Received your \_\_\_\_. It's appreciated; many thanks.
- FIFTY FOUR Many thanks for your good wishes.
- FIFTY FIVE Good news is always welcome. Very delighted to hear about yours.
- FIFTY SIX Congratulations on your \_\_\_\_, a most worthy and deserved achievement.
- FIFTY SEVEN Wish we could be together
- FIFTY EIGHT Have a wonderful time. Let us know when you return.
- FIFTY NINE Congratulations on the new arrival. Hope mother and child are well.
- SIXTY Wishing you the best of everything on \_\_\_\_\_.
- SIXTY ONE Wishing you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
- SIXTY TWO Greetings and best wishes to you for a pleasant \_\_\_ holiday season.
